#### **SUMMARY**

To present resolutions and information on behalf of the Environmental Advisory Committee for Council's consideration.

#### **BACKGROUND**






HARRISON HOT SPRINGS LAGOON AREA MASTER PLAN
















Berm Wall at Beach Washroom AGOON AREA MASTER PLAN


